## Political Platform text

### From line 705 to 707:

Europe must phase out all fossil fuels, starting with coal and fracked gas (see Glossary 68), which must be phased out in Europe by 2027 at the latest. ~~Fossil~~This includes first and foremost the stopping of imports of fossil fuels directly or as soon as possible according to WTO trade law from authoritarian regimes committing the most egregious human rights violations, such as but not limited to breaches of peremptory norms (see Glossary 189) - for example, the Russian Federation. Furthermore, the production and import of fossil fuels must be replaced by renewable and emission-free solutions: wind energy,

189. Peremptory norms: Also *jus cogens* norms. These norms are rules accepted by

(almost) all states, which are of fundamental importance for the international community, and which have universal application and are always valid and may not be derogated from. Examples include the prohibition of genocide, piracy, slavery, racial discrimination, the crime of aggression and the unlawful use of force.

## Reason

### Amendment of PP1 A1.

The phase-out is for all production and consumption, not just for imports. The amendment would thus imply that the phase out from authoritarian regimes should be done by 2027, and that this should start with coal and fracked gas.

Our counter-amendment thus:

1. Specifies that stopping imports of *all* fossil fuels from authoritarian regimes violating human rights must be done directly or as soon as possible
2. ~~Conditioning this on the violation (as a separate sentence)~~ Conditioning this on the violation of the most egregious human rights norms instead of 'basic human rights', such as peremptory norms, and further
3. ~~Adding this to the Glossary~~ Adding this to the sentence after.

Why:

1. For the sake of clarity and the direness of the situation, imports of all fossil fuels from authoritarian regimes must be done as soon as possible, and not
2. ~~as a phase out by 2027~~ as a phase out by 2027. 'basic human rights' is. This could refer to the first civil and political rights enshrined in the ICCPR, or to the rights in the ECHR. However, virtually every state has violated these 'basic' human rights in one way or another, and their subjective interpretation opens the way to assuming every state is in breach of this condition. We thus condition it on the most egregious human rights violations, such as peremptory norms. This sets a clear boundary in which such violations are unacceptable - and would thus include states such as Russia and Saudi Arabia, as the original
