

R14 Solidarity with Ukraine for as long as necessary

Motion text

1 The horrific Russian war of aggression that began on March 9, 2014, turned full-
2 scale on 24 February 2022. The Russian army once again invaded Ukraine,
3 violating sovereignty, international law, and human rights, committing acts of
4 terrorism and genocide.

5 This is not only a war against Ukraine, it is an attack on all of us and our
6 common European values. Russia challenges not only the independence of Ukraine,
7 but also the system of security, peace, rule of law, and democracy in Europe.
8 Since the start of the full-scale invasion, Russia has stepped up its
9 intimidation and threats against democratic states around the world, especially
10 neighbouring countries, as well as intensified its disinformation campaigns,
11 interference in the political processes of independent states, and imposing
12 approval of its aggressive policy, by weaponising food, energy, and migrants.
13 Moreover, Russia is constantly building up its military potential and forging
14 military cooperation with authoritarian states such as Iran, Belarus, China, and
15 North Korea.

16 We continue to condemn in the strongest terms Russia's war and the Belarusian
17 government's involvement in it, the human rights violations and war crimes
18 committed, acts of genocide and terrorism against Ukraine's population,
19 including targeted attacks on civilian infrastructure and houses, forced
20 deportations and massacres in the occupied territories.

21 Over the last year, there has been a growing amount of evidence of war crimes
22 and crimes against humanity committed by Russia during the war in Ukraine.

23 Russian troops, using terrorist methods, deliberately attacked residential areas
24 and civilian infrastructure. As a result, thousands of civilians were killed and
25 injured, and the country's energy infrastructure was severely damaged, leaving
26 tens of millions of Ukrainians without basic needs such as electricity, water,
27 and heat.

28 Russian occupation of Ukrainian territories has brought suffering and turmoil
29 upon millions of people. Russia's policy of forcible Russification is aimed at
30 erasing the Ukrainian identity of local residents. Thousands of civilians under
31 Russian occupation have already been killed, and many others have been subjected
32 to repression and torture, infiltration, kidnapping, persecution, sexual
33 violence, or forced deportation. Russia practices illegal deportation of
34 children to Russian territory and temporarily occupied Crimea, and forced
35 adoption into Russian families, placement in boarding schools, and re-education
36 camps.

37 The Russian invaders deliberately resort to sexual violence against women, men,
38 and even children, which they use as a weapon of war, causing severe physical
39 and psychological trauma to the victims.

40 The Young European Greens stand strongly with Ukraine in its fight for the
41 freedom, democracy, territorial independence, and human rights of the Ukrainian
42 people.

43 We highly appreciate the support and assistance to Ukraine and the Ukrainian
44 people provided by the international community. However, as long as Russia's
45 aggressive war against Ukraine continues, there is still a need for
46 consolidation of international efforts to put pressure on Russia to end attacks
47 on Ukrainian territory and withdraw the invading troops, as well as to support
48 Ukraine in protecting its independence, sovereignty, and territorial integrity.

49 We call on the international community to:

- 50 • Accelerate the pace and volume of military aid to Ukraine to counter the
51 Russian war of aggression. We believe that Ukraine has an inalienable
52 right to self-defense against an aggressor, and successful Ukrainian
53 military operations to de-occupy its own territories are steps towards
54 establishing real peace in the country.

- 55 • Resolutely condemn any form of military aid to Russia and Russian war
56 criminals, as well as contribute to the creation of conditions that will
57 make it impossible to transport equipment or technologies that may have a
58 military purpose from European countries to Russia and Belarus. Military
59 aid to Russia only contributes to the continuation and escalation of the
60 war, increasing the number of victims and suffering among the civilian
61 population.

- 62 • Continue introducing sanctions against Russia and Belarus with the aim of
63

64 reducing their military, political, and economic potential for waging the
65 war, as well as increasing pressure on the citizens of the aggressor
66 countries to form a broad demand for an end to the war and the withdrawal
of the invading troops from the territory of Ukraine.

67 • Applying effective sanctions against countries that support Russia in its
68 aggression and invasion of Ukraine, especially by providing armed support,
69 as well as holding them accountable for complicity in the war.

70 • Impose sanctions on all third countries and companies that help Russia and
71 Belarus to circumvent embargoes and sanctions.

72 • Further strengthen the international isolation of the Russian Federation,
73 including depriving the state of membership in international organisations
74 such as the United Nations Security Council.

75 • Facilitate the creation of an international special tribunal to
76 investigate Russian war crimes in Ukraine and bring Russian and Belarusian
77 political and military leadership and other war criminals to justice.

78 • Increase support and aid for Ukraine, directly and through participation
79 in humanitarian funding appeals initiated by multilateral organisations.

80 • Provide support and protection to ethnic minorities and indigenous peoples
81 who have been affected by Russian imperialism and aggression, such as
82 Crimean Tatars.

83 • Continue supporting Ukrainian war refugees, assisting their integration
84 into the society of the host country, employment, and education.

85 • Avoid any steps that can be interpreted as equating the victim and the
86 aggressor.

87 We, the Young European Greens, firmly maintain that a sustainable and fair peace
88 in Ukraine can only be achieved on Ukraine's terms, and not dictated by the

89 aggressor state. We staunchly advocate for the uncompromising preservation of
90 Ukraine's territorial integrity and sovereignty, and call for the immediate
91 withdrawal of Russian troops from Ukrainian territory, as well as the
92 restoration of Ukraine's borders as defined in the Budapest Memorandum.

93 We also stand against the violation of human rights and international law and
94 call for the prosecution of the aggressor country and all those supporting the
95 Russian war, acts of terrorism, and genocide in Ukraine.
