# Letter of motivation

# Dear green friends,

Right now my main involvement in the party is working full time as an election campaign advisor for a regional branch, where I will be working until the elections in September. Being able to combine my educational background from political science and international relations, with my experience from being active in the young greens both in the national and international level has already been a massive learning experience. And is something that makes me even more motivated and capable to be a good member of the executive committee.

I am a team player, and I believe one of the most important qualities of the members of the executive committee is being able to work well together. I am flexible and take my responsibilities seriously. I am not afraid of a challenge, and I handle pressure well. Of course there will always be room for improvement, but especially in a growing organisation with events that are growing bigger and the

amount of people constantly growing I think this is one of the most important things to keep in mind if we want the most sustainable FYEG possible. Which hopefully only will build on the foundation and make us stronger and have even more impact over time.

And maybe the most important vision I have for FYEG is simply to be as healthy as an organisation can be. Having transparency in all levels, Supporting all of our MOs, and having an office where the employees are happy and treated well.
