Dear Federation of Young European Greens,

I grew up watching mainstream Polish media talk about young people's concerns in two manners, if at all: either as heartwarming activism stories, or as an entitled, privileged generation shouting "for no reason". While youth voices are more and more considered in the policy debate and policymaking, European spaces for green & progressive youth, especially with the funding cuts, are shrinking. Building Mutual Matter, a pan-European socioenvironmental zine, taught me that when you do create and open that space, the ideas that come in are truly special, original, and also deeply political. Ecosprinter has the infrastructure, the people, the capacity and the network to do this at a scale no zine can, and I want to help make that happen.

My Vision

When progressive spaces are under threat, independent media become more important than ever. It is where young people from all over Europe, also outside of the biggest progressive capitals, find community, get inspired, and connect across borders they might never cross otherwise. But right now, as my research shows, young green activists are fragmented: isolated within their own contexts even within the same cities, unaware of what others are building just outside their borders, missing opportunities for creating links and ties for stronger demands and more unified action. A strong Ecosprinter can be the thread that ties those efforts together. A magazine, unlike an event or a working group, extends beyond borders and beyond member organisations. It is a space where young greens can speak as themselves, not as representatives of their national structures, but as individuals with their own ideas, problems, experiences and research.

I saw this potential clearly at Greenhouse 2026 organized by GEF. The discussions I had with participants from different green movements were so rich they could each become an essay. But those conversations stayed within the room, exclusive and closed off to anyone who was not there. Bringing them to an online agora, giving them written form and editorial care, could multiply their impact across the entire network. And the people are ready. They have the ideas, they just need the invitation, the structure, and the assistance to make their words translated into writing and gain potential for even larger impact.

This is why I believe Ecosprinter needs to broaden both its reach and its range. Not every young green wants to read or write the same kind of texts. Some have specific, research-based analyses to share while others may want to write about more personal problems; discrimination, affordable housing, or what it actually feels like to navigate the climate crisis in your daily life. Both of these matter. A publication that holds space for a policy brief on just transition alongside a personal

essay on energy poverty reflects what our generation, and the green part of it, actually looks like – diverse, incisive, and full of ideas – while keeping Ecosprinter open and welcoming, a point of entry into the green community rather than a space reserved for those already inside it. Beyond content, Ecosprinter could host exchanges more actively: through thematic editions that invite contributions from across the network, through events that bring writers and readers together, and through formats that make the magazine not just something to read but something to participate in. There are differences between branches, there are debates – and expanding on them could, paradoxically, bring more nuanced and more unified action, as well as a stronger sense of connection across the green youth, a community we all need, especially now.

Why Me?

This is where my experience comes in. As founder and editor-in-chief of Mutual Matter, I do the full editorial work: selecting submissions, working directly with authors to develop their texts, editing from academic analyses, through toolkits to visual essays, and shaping each edition into something cohesive and accessible. I know what it takes to turn a rough but promising draft into a piece that actually reaches people, and I know how to do it collaboratively, respectfully and without taking the author's voice away. At the same time, as a research assistant at Sciences Po's LIEPP and Centre of Migration Research, I work on the other end of the spectrum, writing and editing publications on climate policy and social protection. That combination of editorial experience with creative and accessible content, alongside academic publishing means I can engage with the full range of what Ecosprinter could and should be. I want to bring that energy to the Editorial Board: sharpening the editorial vision while expanding who it reaches and what role it plays in the green community.

I would be honoured to contribute to the Ecosprinter Editorial Board and to help shape a publication that matches the devotion, ambition and creativity of the young greens it serves.
