Reason

This amendment gives a fuller picture of how imperialism functions today. It makes clear that imperialism is not only about military or direct economic control, but is also maintained through climate injustice, exploitative trade systems, border regimes, racialised exploitation, and resource extraction from the Global South. Including these dimensions strengthens the political analysis and better reflects the structural realities of contemporary imperialism.
