Candidate for the Executive Committee

Dear Member Organisations of the Federation of Young European Greens,

I am delighted to share that I am running for the current opening at the Executive Committee of FYEG. My decision to apply for this position is a combination of timing, ambition, and most of all, the passion I have for the movement. You may not know me as I have not been active at FYEG for long, with the Youth Assembly last April being the first event I attended. In this short time, FYEG has become the perfect marriage of the main forces that drive my political involvement, this including an intercultural community, green activism, non-formal learning and a safe environment. Since the Assembly, my involvement has taken shape in being involved in the Prep Team for the Influencelection Games, the Beyond Growth Platform, and the Prep Team of the Summer Camp. I am eager to continue making friends from all over the place, learn more about the Green Family, and continue to work on making Europe a better place. I hope that reading this letter will give you insights into my motivations and vision for FYEG.

My main motivation to join the Executive Committee is driven by excitement for the upcoming elections: I do not have to convince you about the importance of the upcoming elections; how the time is now, how the climate needs us, and how we must ensure that our continent can be a safe home to anyone. You know this. Which is exactly why I consider this a vital moment during which we need to capitalize of the common awareness, mobilise like-minded people, and form a strong movement to work towards better lives for all. The moment is now, and I would love to do my part in driving us towards where we need to be; a stronghold which is able to amplify the young, green voice so it can really enact change in the system. The change we strive to implement is sourced from, and influential on a greater sphere than just Europe. Therefore, this is also the time to open up our circles to more people from outside the EU and ensure that what we work towards betters humanity as a whole, not just the lives of European citizens. There is no 'l' in system change (nor is there a 'u'), but you get my point: shared goals require shared resolutions.

My own 'Green Base'

But who am I to say this, and where does it come from? My activities at DWARS started some two years ago. Since then, I have organised all our General Assemblies and was in charge of recruiting committee members. Currently, I serve as campaign and social media manager on my local board, participate in writing our new Political Platform and work as Political Advisor for International Affairs. I also worked towards recovering the status of an international presence at DWARS since our International Board Position was removed. These experiences have given me insight into designing a campaign, activism mobilisation, network building and youth participation. I am currently continuing my internship period at the Greens in the Dutch House of Representatives. My parliamentary work is focused on managing two policy portfolios: circular economy and climate which fall under the jurisdiction of a member of parliament (MP) who was elected helped by DWARS' campaign as she is our only MP under thirty. I have learnt a great deal from her about persistence, self-care and empowering communities, and she remains an example of what it takes to fight a system which is not structured to serve you. I prepare debates, go on work visits, draft parliamentary

inquiries and engage with lobbyists to form our 'political line'. Most notably, the last months were marked by the judicial persecution of Chemours and Tata Steel, two companies whose activities have greatly damaged the environment and public health of their surrounding areas. Attending the hearing of these two companies and seeing them leave and be allowed to continue their work without repercussions was tough, but a needed reality check.

Over the course of my internship, I was also allowed to help out GroenLinks' PR and social media. I helped with making TikTok's, preparing press releases and editing our posts. This has made me aware of the power of social media in shaping communities, and the power it can yield in informing and activating. Rather unexpectedly, working in parliament has helped me intensify my activism as I have seen how slow and tedious the progress is. Following the collapse of my government, I am currently assisting the campaigning team of the Dutch Green Office. This consists of a number of events, including marches, canvassing, Town Halls, and other actions to spread the message of our campaign. Overall, I'd say I am **well organised**, apt in **planning events**, writing policies, political strategy and community building. My current involvement in the election campaign, as well as having contributed to the political program help with the upcoming tasks associated with the profile.

Good morning girlboss, let's get this bread:

Though I generally despise national stereotypes, it has been said to me that I present a funny mix of traits associated with the Dutch and the Irish. One the one hand, I value direct communication, I work well under pressure and with deadlines, and I am very pragmatic. On the other, I strive to keep my working environments enjoyable, I love meeting new people, and I would like to think of myself as a good friend and pleasant person to know. I am well aware of the systems and build ups of MOs and how each unique organisation can benefit from 'personal' attention. My main driver is the fact that I, quite simply, care. I care about our shared cause, I care for the people we impact and the people who put in the work, and I care that MO's can function as a safe space for the people we tackle our challenges with. This shapes my prioritization of communication and interpersonal connection, despite the challenges of language and distance. I consider myself very competent in maintaining my communication channels, ensuring that needs and demands are met, and most importantly, that people feel heard. I think my (sometimes excessive) care can contribute to stronger bonds within FYEG and hopefully also help shape new connections outside our network.

I work systematically, clearly stipulating long-term goals and setting up smaller measurable objectives along the way, which drive cooperation and cohesion at the same time. I have generally had to juggle a lot of functions also makes sure I take into account durability, assuring there are also checkpoints on ensuring the longevity of plans in the contexts of people who are involved in carrying them out. Finally, my work in drafting campaign plans and as a policy officer especially help with this, as it requires a deep understanding of the challenges and roadblocks ahead of the experience. I am by no means a perfect planner, but as I do love doing it, so I am very much open to advice and excited to keep honing my craft. Finally, to address the big elephant in the room in context of the tasks of this function; I am evidently not from the South. Not being from a Southern MO means there is a lot to learn about different ways of communicating, organising and the unique cultures within the organisations. I am well aware that this requires effort, but I would be incredibly excited to immerse myself and interact with people from outside my own region. As mentioned before, I consider myself a good communicator, and hope that through a lot of interaction, I will be able to provide, assist and of course also hang out with the MOs. As per the call, this will also be assisted by the Secretary-General, and I have full trust in that through shared work and interest, I could be a good and fun South Regional responsible.

Going with the tide but remaining on course

My vision on the role of a European political youth organisation is twofold. On the one hand, I think it is important to remain flexible; the current political status quo, as well as the global 'situation' is instable and marked by unprecedented events and challenges. On the other, there are core tasks we should fulfil, most importantly: promote the voice of the youth and create a network of young active people. If we want durable politics which make decisions which benefit society in the long term, we need age diversity. Though people from other generations can imagine the circumstances which young people live under, they do not live the lives we do. This generation will live on this earth the longest, therefore we should have a substantial role to play in decision making, as we have to live with the consequences the longest. For this we need to train, equip and nurture leaders, but we also need an active and motivated participants from across places to spread the word. This requires they are cared for, informed, and feel at home in the organisation. Empowerment should be the key task of a European organisation, to ensure young people feel supported and safe enough to create a positive impact.

There is no legitimacy in a political organisation if you don't do the work you promise to do. This means we should always make sure we respect people, work on the issues that are important to a specific organisation and stand up for our values. This can be done through informative events, campaigns, networking events, protests; whatever, but saying you believe in something and actively working to achieve and expand on the goals and values of an organisation are what matter most. Finally, I think it is very important to keep our eyes and channels open. Globalisation is a funny thing, and the concept of Europe is complicated to begin with. Of course, European politics and European communities are important to FYEG, but interacting with organisations, people and events outside of what we consider 'Europe' is vital to remain effective and relevant. Climate, migration and social rights are issues which aren't retained by borders, and I do believe solutions and the knowledge behind them can be found through international cooperation and exchange. Therefore, its important we look outside of our European sphere to find likeminded people and organisations to work with. The change we wish to enact is ultimately the product of international schools of thought, and we should continue expanding our presence and interaction to make due diligence and keep developing.

My involvement within the green movement is adding up to two years this January. Though this might not seem like that long, it sure does feel like it, and I feel like have evolved through positions at both DWARS and FYEG rather intensively. My committee work, volunteering, campaign experience and internship have prepared me for the next step, and it seems the timing is lining up well. I feel motivated and prepared to deepen my commitment to FYEG and continue my learning journey, all whilst meeting new inspiring people. At the end of the day, the people make the movement, and the movement makes the people, and I am incredibly motivated by the prospect of continuing to be inspired by our people, and hopefully, inspire someone else along the way. Should I be elected, I would be honoured to do my part in the EC and for the organisation, the MO's and all those involved. I am ready to work on the tasks associated with this function, and I am more than happy to fail, adapt and improve along the way. In an association marked by such perseverance and unchallenged willingness as ours, I have no doubt we will continue sharing stories, organise communities, and kick ass. I hope this overview has given me insight into my political stances, personal profile, skills and learning points, and you share my opinion of myself as a suitable candidate for this position.

Dare to Care

From the streets to the Parliament: Activism as the primary foundational springboard for enacting political change. Heading into the EU24 elections, the pressure to fortify our movement and to take action now is increasing. I truly believe diamonds are made under pressure, and though it will require a lot of work, now is the perfect time to redefine our future. The recent success of the climate movement in my own country saw activists blocking the highway next to the House of Representatives every day, until Parliament agreed to policy change, has reinforced the idea that change takes more than words. If we want a political environment which protects our environments, secures human rights, fights for equality, we cannot be ignored: it is our fucking future and it is up to us to demand the system listens and adapts to us. I also believe activism is key in creating tight knit communities where new ideas are shared, plans are formed and people become engaged. Activism should not just be the vehicle for change, but also the cradle for expanding our movements. Politically, I want to make FYEG a vested presence in the activism sphere, so we have a greater platform to work from, but also find new partners to work with. I want FYEG to keep pushing for change until politics takes care of society instead of distrusting it, until all children can enjoy their rights despite the circumstances in which they were born, until climate justice equals social justice, and until Europe can consider itself a place where justice and freedom are non-negotiables.

Norms and values don't stop at borders: International solidarity. Current and ongoing crises have made clear that the issues we are individually experiencing are signs of a greater process. It is important to reiterate that there is no European future without a future for people outside what we consider Europe. I envision FYEG as a amalgamation of the point of views of all the MOs, creating a consolidated, diverse platform from which we advocate for inclusive proposals. In this sense, the better the bonds within FYEG, the better the developmental capacity to expand and establish new connections with movements in progress. Nuance, deliberation and dialogue lie at the centre of keeping this social contextualization going, which is needed in an organisation consisting of as many traditions, cultures and characteristics as FYEG. As tough as this can be, finding consensus within the movement is important if we aim to challenge the status quo which is rooted in diametrically opposed values. Thus, I would rather see difficult but necessary discourse amongst FYEG to create a more robust understanding and bonds built on mutual respect. Internal solidarity is needed to emit external solidarity, which eases visibility and helps to inspire others. This includes non-negotiables such as support for Ukraine, protecting human rights and fighting fascist

systems. FYEG needs to be vocal on issues such as democratic backsliding, infringement of human rights, far right movements to express solidarity and empower young activists. At a time where basic civil rights such as self-determination and access to humanitarian aid are not guaranteed, FYEG must take a stance in the face of injustice, and speak up as one, unified, voice.

Community, Ideology, Communication: Call a spade a spade, and move to

improve. Who and what we represent determines who we attract. As within my own Member Organization, our membership does not reflect the diversity of the social environment of Europe. A diverse input of knowledge and experience is needed to make due on the ideologies at the heart of FYEG. To continue pushing for proposals and organising campaigns which ensure rights for everyone, no matter their gender, sexuality, ethnicity, age or any other characteristic, we need representation to develop our ideology. I believe mobilisation is made possible by assuring FYEG's structures and organisations embody open and safe spaces, welcome to everyone. This can be achieved through accessible, clear and honest communication, both within MOs and through FYEG's own communication channels. This can be achieved through working with partners with the same values and creating a joint platform from which we reach and hopefully inspire those who feel a lack of agency, as well as including narratives highlighting inclusive community building. This is especially important for the EU24 campaign, which will require an increase of visibility to mobilise and inspire those further away from the Brussels Bubble. Moreover, I hope to contribute to strengthening and supporting MOs from Southern Europe and Central Easter Europe, and expand interaction with organisations from MENA. Listening is vital, but in order to listen to stories we must first create a sense of trust and acceptance so our membership becomes more diverse and inclusive.

Being critical of something just means you care enough about it to want it to improve. Let's stay sharp, stay kind and create an organisation for and about everybody.

MOTIVATION LETTER ANJA PRESNUKHINA

My journey in the green movement began in late 2016 when I realized that nature cannot speak for itself and that effecting change around me requires political action. Since then, I've been active in political parties, NGOs, and direct action movements.

Recently the University of Helsinki Greens, whose chairperson I am, took an active part in the organising of the most long-lasting University sit-in in Finland. Our student-building occupation started a wave of local sit-ins all across the country and acted as a starting point for building a strong anti-government leftist movement which would not only campaign against the cuts to the education system but also channel the voices of those who are traditionally not taken into the spotlight of the media coverage: the precariat, immigrants and racialised people.

Looking at my professional background, I have experience working in both FYEG and Finnish Young Greens offices, which gives me a solid understanding of the dynamics of these organisations and motivation to make the cooperation of the EC and office even more effective.

As a Campaign Team member I am already involved in the FYEG election campaign and it is something that I want to work more on from not only the operational side but from the more political and strategical side as that is something that the EC has a mandate on. My experience in campaigning comes from the regional elections of 2021, the internal campaigns of the SecGen of Green Party Anna Moring and the University Council elections of last year. Most "high-level" campaigning that I've done has been the Parliamentary elections campaign of the Young Greens as a Project manager. During the election Spring, we have also been involved with the national level of the campaign through the mother party.

As EC members are also serving as the advocates of FYEG and its different actors, I want to be very clear about who am I advocating for. My initial aim is to support those members who feel left out and silenced in our political spaces. Examples of this are the non-EU MOs and already marginalized communities within our spaces. Advocacy is not only a thing that I like, but also something that I have experience in for example from leading the Greens of my University and acting as a member of the Finnish Green Party Council as a spokesperson of the Youth group.

Why would I make a great EC member? My broad experience around the Green movement both as a professional and political actor gives me a good overview of what we have in our hands now. But most importantly, this is a position to which I am committed to give loads of my time, love and energy. FYEG has given so much to me personally, and over the course of years, it has become so close to my heart that I want to do my best to give the same experience to as many young people as possible. You can read more about my concrete plans about it in the Outline file.

OUTLINE OF MY PLANS IN FYEG AS IN OCTOBER 2023

To understand, what are my plans in FYEG I want to first understand what the Green European movement means and what challenges are we facing now and within the next year. As of now, I think that being a movement and not a classical political party in its traditional sense gives us a lot of strength in the ability to balance between activism and parliamentary democracy, but also makes finding a common value base harder. In this document, I will address my plans through X major themes that I want to work towards.

Genuinely inclusive FYEG

What does inclusivity mean if we don't directly put work towards it? Is there a point in expanding an organisation if its already existing members do not feel secure and at home? Inclusion is not something that we can write on a wall and take for granted but is a resource-consuming commitment, which might make the majority feel uncomfortable.

By this, I mean that as a member of the EC, I commit to actively pushing for more serious acts in the inclusion work of FYEG. We have to hold ourselves accountable and be open about our, sometimes unjust decisions. It is simply embarrassing to externally advocate for those things that we cannot even keep up with internally.

Non-EU MO inclusion is a key point in fighting the polarization of the East vs West dichotomy that doesn't help any of the sides.

Brave movement

FYEG is not afraid to speak out on the issues that are connected with its members and the issues which are against its values. Our organisation is not hesitant to try to pay more attention to the burning topics and actors that are overlooked or silenced. Brave space also means that the office and the EC are actively working towards facilitating respectful dialogues even around the "touchy" subjects. We cannot be taken seriously if we are not allowed to take a stand against violence or unscientific claims. As a Southern MO responsible I commit to giving my resources to ensure that these conversations happen between the MOs themselves but also towards the office and EC.

Internal advocacy

By this, I mean that as a representative of the FYEG in spaces like EGP, Green Group and my mother party, I am ready to advocate for our values and goals. As the EC is a body made out of volunteers and as the office is running at its best and most professionalized capacity, I want to work towards preparing the office members to be ready to advocate for us.

Building up towards the elections

As a member of the Campaign Team, and more specifically the Green Base, I have been involved in building up the Discord community of volunteers, candidates and other people who just want to be involved in the process of building up towards the EU elections. The role of the EC is to take part in the political aspects of the campaign work and that is something I have a great passion for. As a region representative, I want to ensure that the MOs have all the resources to get as many cool and young candidates as there are!

First and foremost, the South Regional responsibility is a crucial aspect of FYEG's vision. It is crucial for members coming from the Southern Regions to boost their organizations and act on matters that demand our attention and actions. Follow-ups and consistent updates need to be followed, in order to incorporate the major events that took place the following months in these countries. This action will not only serve as a liaison but will also guide and support activities, ensuring that the voices and concerns of young greens from the Southern Regions are heard. More events and actions should also take place in these countries, in order to moderate regional meetings and provide help, where needed.

Support and solidarity are necessary, as on a political, environmental, and humanitarian level, our countries need help and light should be shed upon their matters.

Secondly, FYEG envisions active involvement in the development of the FYEG Strategy 2025-2030. Introduction

My name is Kelsey Trevett (they/them), and I'm the former Co-Chair and Equality & Diversity officer of the Young Greens of England and Wales. I'm a recent graduate from a BA programme in Philosophy, Politics, and economics, and have a strong background in campaigning, within and beyond the Green movement, for intrinsically-linked social and climate justice. I'm a young queer disabled activist, and bring my background, personal and professional experience to the table, advocating for an unapologetically anticapitalist political platform, brought about by diverse and inclusive organising. I can be found with my guide dog, Lacey -- a strong advocate of UBI (universal biscuit income!) --, and often at a protest, demonstration, or on a picket line.

The need for strong, powerful, organised youth leadership on the intrinsically-linked social and climate crises has never been more crucial. With the failure of political leadership to take the bold decisions necessary now to protect people and planet, contextualised by democratic backsliding, attacks on the rights of women and LGBTIQA+ people, and the prioritisation of profits and billionaires over our future, FYEG has a key role to play in 2024 and beyond. With my two years of experience as Co-Chair of the Young Greens of England and Wales, and my background in campaigns, strategy, and facilitating cooperation within networks, I feel my skillset would be a valuable addition to the FYEG EC as we work hard towards the European elections and beyond.

From 2021-2023, I was elected as the Co-Chair of the Young greens of England and Wales, a role which granted me the opportunity to develop and exercise skills directly relevant to the work of the FYEG EC. Co-chairing a committee of 20 members, all of whom were volunteering their time alongside their studies or work, allowed me to develop not only my teamwork skills, but also my ability to prioritise the committee's collective wellbeing, building strong connections with committee members to ensure open and trusting working relationships. As Co-Chair, I supported other portfolio holders with a variety of projects, ranging from political education to international work with FYEG, and led on projects where capacity was lacking. This included running our biggest local election campaign ever, almost doubling the number of elected Young Green councillors in England and Wales in 2023, as well as planning and delivering our flagship residential training programme 30 Under 30 in March this year. Both of these activities required close liaison with stakeholders, coordinating plans and communications, and adapting messaging and activities for the specific circumstances of a variety of campaigns. As we approach the 2024 European elections, I feel that this experience and flexibility will be effective in working with the European Green Party, and the wider Green family, to deliver strong results.

When elected in 2021, one of our first projects was to begin the process of creating a five-year strategy for the Young Greens of England and Wales — an activity which I feel places me in a strong position to carry out work on the FYEG 2025-2030 strategy if elected. In creating our strategy, we worked with key stakeholders to identify areas of interlocking activity, establishing short, medium, and long-term goals, as well as steps towards achieving them. This strategy focussed on increasing our electoral force, movement building in local communities and in educational institutions, and embedding ourselves in the broader civil society movement for change and liberation of marginalised communities. I am excited at the prospect of bringing this experience to FYEG, to develop a five-year strategy which seeks to strengthen our existing network, increase its scope and reach, and elect more young Greens at the regional, national, and European level, as well as within structures such as trade and student unions.

Prior to my election as Co-Chair of the Young Greens of England and Wales, I served a year as its equality & Diversity officer, and my passion for this area of work remains strong. Over the past few years, I have worked on initiatives to diversify the Green movement in England and Wales: introducing diversity criteria onto the Young greens of England and Wales' flagship training programme; organising at the Green Party of England and Wales' conferences to support motions for liberation, including successfully for policy supporting the self identification of gender, and for improved internal guidance on antisemitism; and designing and delivering political education events to draw attention to interlocking forms of social discrimination, and our movement's role in tackling them. As a queer disabled person, I have experienced some of the challenges those from marginalised backgrounds can face in political involvement. Our recognition of the interlocking nature of climate and social justice, and our movement's roots in protest and resistance, mandates that liberation must lie at the heart of our politics, and by consequence at the heart of our activity as an organisation. If elected, I am keen to put my experience and passion towards building an even more diverse pan-European movement, to ensure that the welcoming and inclusive experience I have enjoyed with FYEG is always the case.

Earlier this year, I had the honour of being selected as a Prep Team member fort FYEG's youth assembly in Brussels. This experience represents one of the highlights of my year, allowing me to work with a team of activists from across FYEG, to create an inspiring, energised, and exciting event alongside the Green group in the European Parliament. I gained a deeper insight into the workings of FYEG, and the interaction between its different bodies, as well as getting to learn from young campaigners and candidates from so many member organisations. I am excited at the possibility of progressing this work, supporting, and continuing to learn from, the southern region,

and putting my network building skills to good use in facilitating projects and cooperation between member organisations.

Carrying out my responsibilities as Co-Chair alongside full-time university studies in politics and philosophy necessitated that I developed exceptional time management skills, and the ability to maintain my own wellbeing so as to be able to avoid burnout. However, on top of this, I retained my engagement with a wide range of non-partisan campaigning activity. I served a year as the LGBTQ+/Disability intersectional officer at the University of Oxford, supporting queer disabled students, including working with them to develop accessibility guides for queer venues and events in the city. I continued working with a range of civil society organisations in the UK to improve the education opportunities and outcomes for young visually impaired people — a passion driven by my own experience —, and also worked closely with the University and College Union (UCU) to build student solidarity throughout an extended period of industrial action, culminating in a piece published in a Nature journal. I include this here to illustrate not only my own background, but also my commitment, passion, and experience working in a range of different environments, building and maintaining professional relationships beyond the green movement.

This summer, whilst living in Brussels, I undertook an internship focussing on the development of political narratives, with particular attention paid to the rise of far-right narratives in the UK and central and eastern Europe. As well as exposing me to the realities of the European institutions, this opportunity has given me an insight into the construction of political narratives, which I believe will be integral to progressing the work of FYEG as we approach and look beyond next year's elections. Constructing a narrative of hope, inspiring action from even broader swathes of society, will be vital to the growth of FYEG in the years to come, and I'm excited to embed this understanding into the work of building FYEG's networks, and beginning the design of the 2025-2030 strategy.

We have no time to waste. Crucial elections approach in 2024, and our planet burns. If given the opportunity, I would be honoured and excited to put my skills and experience, from within and beyond the Green movement, to use in propelling the work of FYEG forward. We have the talent and ambition to build a diverse movement, focussed and strategic, which brings young people from across Europe with us in our pursuit of social, environmental, racial and economic justice. I hope to have the opportunity to play my part in that work as a member of the FYEG EC,, and in the meantime welcome any questions you may have.

Yours in solidarity, Kelsey Trevett When I joined the Green Party of England and Wales in 2019, I did so for two reasons. Firstly, a fear of what I saw around me: a climate crisis out of control, intertwined social inequality growing rapidly, and a government not only failing to act, but failing to care. Overwhelmingly, I joined for the second reason: hope. I saw a political project which was built on a vision not just for something better than this, but something altogether positive. I was energised especially by young people taking leadership, advocating for ecosocialism, and working together to build a movement which was connected, diverse, and effective. The fact that the vision and the movement is never static, and is instead a process, is what gives us our strength. Here's an outline of how we develop that process in FYEG.

Connected

Our member organisations are undertaking fantastic work in their respective countries, and achieving unprecedented success. Providing even more opportunities for sharing learnings, successes, and skills is vital to building a strong pan-European network. FYEG already offers so many chances for this: in Ireland, this summer, the English and Welsh, Scottish, and Irish Young Greens came together for a summer camp, to forge exactly these sorts of connections between member organisations. I would like to support member organisations in the southern region, and across FYEG, to implement similar initiatives, working within their capacity, to connect and empower activists, and motivate them for the 2024 European Parliament elections and beyond.

Diverse

FYEG has the capacity to be a movement which champions the diversity of the communities with which we work. Empowering activists from traditionally marginalised backgrounds to get involved with organising and standing for election is vital, first and foremost to pursuing our values. Funding and facilitating training initiatives for those from underrepresented groups, reaching out to existing campaigns to develop and maintain connections, and encouraging member organisations to push for diversity within their candidate selection processes are all tangible steps FYEG can take towards diversifying our movement for the years ahead, and in preparation for the 2029 European Parliament elections.

Effective

Our movement is most impactful when it works to an ambitious strategy which has broad buy-in from our membership. Following the European Parliament elections in 2024, we need a strong political strategy which focusses on building a movement for change, both within and beyond the electoral sphere. Delivering political education and skills training, developing a political platform which is unashamedly anticapitalist, and embedding ourselves in campaigns for social justice, liberation, and climate justice in order to mobilise these networks at pivotal moments — this is how we create change from the grassroots. This also entails working with the existing Green family, to continue to influence the broader political agenda with our ideas for radical societal transformation, direct action, and youth-led democratic policy.
